

I can find no state info for California. This is what I received from Ray. I have removed his last name as I did not ask his permission to post his email on the internet.

I retired from the CHP as a sergeant in May 2006. As of that time the following is the Department's procedures concerning out-of-state officers, active and retired:

Active officers - 1) Inspect officer's agency issued identification; 2) Verify officer's state issued driver's license; 3) Use sound professional judgment when encountering an active LEO from another state carrying a concealed firearm

Retired officers - 1) Inspect the retired officer's agency issued identification (either option in HR-2128 is acceptable); 2) Verify the retired officer's state issued driver's license; 3) Use sound professional judgment when encountering a retired LEO from another state carrying a concealed firearm.

All policies related to HR-218 are contained in CHP Manual 70.8, Firearms.

The officers in my area (post, barracks, troop, etc) indicated that so long as there was no inappropriate conduct on the part of the out-of-state officer, they would follow steps #1 and #2 and then say "Have a nice visit". Several said they might call me concerning the validity of the agency issued id card. I've collected police insignia since 1977 and have seen a lot of ID cards, so I guess they figured I was an "expert".

Any way's, I have not heard of any changes.
